LADY RAMS MAKE IT FIVE STRAIGHT TO STATE

The Roseau Rams girls basketball team won the Section 8AA team championship on Friday night, defeating Crookston, 73-58.

Coach Kelsey Didrikson was delighted after her girls swept the playoffs, defeating Bagley (93-20), Barnesville (77-57), Breckenridge (83-71), and Crookston (73-58).

With just two early season losses to Grand Forks Red River and Alexandria, it's been a memorable season for the 28-2 Lady Rams.

Mention her players, and she provides a thumbnail scouting report.

"Hanna Mooney is a competitor. She's a Mooney and has the instinct to compete and win."

Who's your center?

"We don't have one," she laughed. "We really don't start a center."

It figures.

The tallest starter is Kacie Borowicz, who's five foot eight.

"There's a reason our slogan this year is 'Never play small!" said Coach D, delighted that the Lady Rams earned the number one seed.

"We play Wednesday night at 6 p.m. against Redwood Valley (19-8) at Williams Arena," she said.

What's different about this team?

"You know like they say, 'They're all different.' This year wasthe most gratifying because we graduated six seniors last year, and so we really had to rebuild and get the next group of girls ready and plugged in," she said.

"It's fun to see the hard work pay off, and it was probably the toughest grind because you have to work hard every day in order to be ready."

Meet the Players

For Coach Didrikson and her assistants, Isaac Erickson and Katie Laugen, it's all about team effort.

Take Shavonda Bender, a ninth grader. "She hustles, and her job is to go in there and bang around and make things happen. We look for her to be a presence on defense and fight for the 50/50 balls," said Kelsey.

Next is sophomore Morgan Boroos.

"She's in and out of the starting lineup depending how we go. She's just really focused, wants to do so well, is hard working, and does whatever she can to contribute," said Didrikson.

Hanna Mooney is a 9th grade starter.

"She had the best game of her career on Tuesday night in the semifinal with 13 points. More than the points, she was flying around making things happen, playing bigger than she actually is."

Next, Julia Braaten, a sophomore, was a member of the 2017 state championship team.

"She's experienced, knows what's going on, and is skilled at making things happen."

Emma Waling is one of the two seniors on the team.

"She was a gym rat, especially growing up. She shoots the ball really well and plays really good defense. Emma's our defensive leader."

Of course, there are the Borowicz sisters, senior Kacie and sophomore Katie the scoring magicians.

Asked if the sisters get along, Kelsey Didrikson laughed.

"It depends on the day. It'll even vary minute to minute in practice. They make each other better."

Everyone contributes in a successful program.

"Faith Berger and Masynn Janicke don't see much playing time, but they practice hard so we are prepared," said Coach D.

"The whole bench knows their job is to make us better in practice and be prepared for the games."

Five straight to state hasn't lost its appeal.

"It never gets old going to state." said Didrikson. "It's awesome that the com-

munity, the fans, the kids, and the parents are enjoying this."

This season was no fluke.

"Hopefully, you're playing your best basketball in March, and the kids feel confident and are comfortable in their roles," said Didrikson. "Honestly, I'm really proud of this team because this is our second best record (28-2) of the five-year run. Who'd have imagined that after graduating six seniors last year?"

Confidence Man

Assistant Coach Isaac "Ike" Erickson knows what makes this team extremely special.

"We have two first-team, all-staters in the Borowicz sisters. That's what helps make us tick. Along with that, our next two best players are Emma Waling and Julia Braaten," he said.


There's more credit to go around.
